Upon successful completion of the Advanced Sequential Approach to Pediatric Plagiocephaly course, the learner will have the have an organized approach to evaluating and the osteopathic manipulative treatment of plagiocephaly. The treatment techniques will be intended to either generally or specifically improve a patient's clinical presentation, while concurrently deepening the practitioners understanding and skill of applied osteopathic medicine.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

After completion of the course, participants will be expected to:

1. Understand the evaluation of plagiocephaly and warning signs of craniosynostosis;
2. Understand measuring misshapen heads and monitoring changes;
3. Be aware of other issues related to plagiocephaly; and
