We will have discussions on the following topics:
The force of the autoregulation system. The difference between the compensation system and healing process. Presentation on the physical consequences of stress and emotions on the mechanisms responsible for the maintenance of health and balance. Comparison of theories between Still's views of the dynamic interactions of physical systems and biochemistry and Physics Nobel Prize winner Murray Gell-Mann's concepts relating to biochemistry and the quantum realm. The physiology constantly tends towards normality. Osteopathy restores the functional state of various mechanisms and relieves obstacles that hinder this natural motion towards health. Description of this natural movement's components.

COURSE TOPICS

- The value and power of the autoregulation system according to tradition and the latest scientific discoveries.
- Solutions to treat somato-visceral and viscera-somatic dysfunctions with taking into account the patient's tolerance to stress and emotion.
- Osteopathy's action in the quantum realm.

Each patient is unique and responds to physical and emotional trauma in different ways. Often our patients manifest a certain degree of well-being but do not reach a full expression of their vitality or a complete resolution of their health problems. This seminar will look at ways to help patients reach this level of recovery and healing. Philippe Druelle D.O. (Can) has developed this field of practice over the last 38 years, and will be proposing a synthesis of strategies and methods to treat patients in chronic and acute conditions, as well as solutions for physically challenged children. This clinical practice oriented course has been appreciated in Europe, Japan and Russia as it responds to the daily enquiries of an osteopath as it touches different domains of work.

PART I

- Physical, dynamic and quantum energetic assessment of the patient. Practice and palpatory tools.
- Notion of anchoring: definition and practice. The entrance point into a treatment using the Life Field.
- How to define and assess the impact of a physical shock, the vulnerability to stress and the importance of hidden or conscious emotion for each patient. Detailed description of the consequences depending on the resilience and compensations demonstrated by the patient.
- Dynamic representation of emotions and the central chain elements (based on TAO and modern experiments). Differences between adults and children. Palpation lab for organ parenchyma. The continuity of the body along the fascial chains as a physical, fluidic and quantum entity.
- Importance of the belief system of each individual on the compensation or intrusion mechanism of emotion and healing process. How to proceed beyond psycho-emotional barriers. Clinical examples to better define the needs of each patient.

PART II

- Importance of the fluid and liquid dynamics at the level of the brain and cord in relation to the reciprocal tension membranes. Normality and pathological states during membrane retraction and/or fluids and nervous system dilation. Assessment and treatment techniques for restrictions or dilations of the cord and vascular network.
- Normalization of the ventricles (advanced version) including the terminal ventricle at T12-T12. The undulation dynamic regulation of the fluids within the cord's living matter (intuition of Anne Wales D.O.).
- Volumetric normalization of key areas: insula, thalamus, prefrontal cortex, limbic system with hippocampus and amygdale).
- Importance of the brain's vascularisation for functional disorders and the cord in chronic conditions. Work of the cord in relation to the vascular network: medulla oblongata area, cord regions of C6-T2, T8-L2. Clinical examples and practices related to chronic inflammation and dysfunctions.

PART III

- Presentation of different methods to fight the 3 types of inflammation. Practice, techniques and methods.
- Spontaneous regulation of the autonomies within the encephalon and physiology. Importance of the central chain's health. Autonomic system and the management of the central chain elements.
- Importance of the vagus nerve within chronic pain and inflammation. Solutions and strategies.
- Polyvagal theory from an osteopathic point of view. Detailed description of the vagus nerve functions to better understand patient symptoms. The ventral and dorsal systems with their psycho-emotional and affect correspondences which influence our energy level and survival. Strategy and practice in Osteopathy.

PART III (CONT.)

- Encephalic, cardiac and mesenteric brains. Practice and dynamics at the physical, fluidic and vibrational level. The heart as a main messenger to the brain: our emotions witness.
- Retroactive loop between the adrenals, the enteric system and the encephalon.

PART IV

- Practical work related to the notion of biomechanics, biodynamics and bioenergetics. How to specifically work at the quantum level.
- Working with the Breath of Life or universal force within the quantum realm. What does this level of work bring to our practice?
- Work to regenerate circuits and networks, interactions and changes within the living matter.
- Notion of balance and its quest within the quantum realm.
- Working with universal energy and the quantum realm. Description of psycho-emotional obstacles and the belief system of each person. What is a positive or limiting belief? How to define it?

This course will provide an opportunity to increase the practitioner's efficiency by defining the levels a patient needs to restore his internal dynamics towards health. Philippe Druelle D.O.
