A) Regular Osteopathic Physician Member - \$100 a year

A Regular Member Shall Be Any Us Trained Osteopathic Physician Who:

1. Holds Doctor Of Osteopathic Medicine (Doctor Of Osteopathy) Degree From A College Of Osteopathic Medicine Accredited By The Commission On Osteopathic College Accreditation (Coca)
2. Holds An Unrestricted License To Practice In Any Of The United States Or Us Territories, Or Is An Active Duty Officer In The Medical Corps Of The United States Military.
3. At Time Of Application, Is A Regular Member Of The American Academy Of Osteopathy.
4. Has Completed And Submitted An Application
5. Has Remitted Appropriate Dues
6. Complies With Article Xiii, Statement Of The Code Of Ethics

B) Associate Non-Osteopathic Physician Member - \$100 a year

Associate Members Will Have The Privileges Of A Regular Member Except For The Right To Vote. An Associate Member Shall Be Any Us Trained Physician Or Dentist Who:

1. Holds Doctor Of Medicine (Md) Or Doctor Of Dental Medicine Or Surgery (Dmd, Dds) Degree From An Accredited College Or University Within Their Specialty.

2. Holds An-Appropriate License To Practice In Any Of The United States Or Us Territories, Or Is An Active Duty Officer In The Medical Corps Of The United States Military.
3. At Time Of Application, Is An Associate Member Of The American Academy Of Osteopathy.
4. Has Completed And Submitted An Application
5. Has Remitted Appropriate Dues
6. Complies With Article Xiii, Statement Of Code Of Ethics

C) Affiliate International Osteopath Members - \$120 a year

Affiliate Members Will Have The Privileges Of A Regular Member Except For The Right To Vote. An Affiliate Member Shall Be Any Internationally Trained Osteopath, Physician Or Dentist Who:

1. Holds And Appropriately Accredited Degree In Their Specialty
2. Is Properly Licensed Or Certified To Practice Their Specialty Within The Country They Reside And/Or Work.
3. At The Time Of Application, Is An Affiliate Member In Good Standing Of The American Academy Of Osteopathy
4. Has Completed And Submitted An Application
5. Is Approved By The Executive Board Of The AAPO
6. Has Remitted Appropriate Dues
7. Complies With Article Xiii, Statement Of Code Of Ethics

D) Resident Members - \$60 (One time fee)

Resident Members Will Have The Privileges Of A Regular Member Except For The Right To Vote. A Resident Member Shall Be Any Us Trained Physician Who:

1. Holds Doctor Of Osteopathic Medicine (Do) Degree From A College Of Osteopathic Medicine Accredited By The Commission On Osteopathic College Accreditation (Coca) Or Holds A Doctor Of Medicine (Md) Degree From A Medical College Accredited By The Liaison Committee On Medical Education.(Lcme).

2. Holds A Training License To Practice In Any Of The United States Or Us Territories And Is Enrolled In An Accredited Us Residency Program Of Any Specialty.
3. At Time Of Application, Is A Member In Good Standing Of The Resident American Academy Of Osteopathy.
4. Has Completed And Submitted An Application
5. Has Remitted Appropriate Dues
6. Complies With Article Xiii, Statement Of The Code Of Ethics

E) Student Members - \$40 (One time fee)

Student Members Will Have The Privileges Of A Regular Member Except For The Right To Vote. A Student Member Shall Be Any Medical Or Dental Student Who:

1. Is Enrolled In College Of Osteopathic Medicine Accredited By The Commission On Osteopathic College Accreditation (Coca) Or Is Enrolled In A Medical College Accredited By The Liaison Committee On Medical Education.(Lcme) Or Is Enrolled In An Accredited Dental School.
2. At Time Of Application, Is A Member In Good Standing Of The Student American Academy Of Osteopathy.
3. Has Completed And Submitted An Application
4. Has Remitted Appropriate Dues
5. Complies With Article Xiii, Statement Of The Code Of Ethics

CODE OF ETHICS
